Kupper Subaru donations tripled



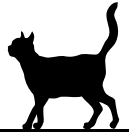

One day at a time

Our shelter has often been referred to as a revolving door, which is technically accurate, but it makes me a bit sad to think of our work that way. We are not stocking shelves, or refilling soda cans to satisfy a thirsty public. We house animals. We nurture animals. We try our best to heal their wounds, physical and emotional. These living, breathing, feeling creatures that come to us under as many different circumstances you can imagine.

If you have ever loved and lost a special animal, you know the feeling of wishing for just one more day spent with your best friend. What we would give for that, right? It's why we try to help everyone that comes in. But like you, we get frustrated with the reasons people give up their pets.

They don't match the furniture. The family is moving and will adopt again after they're settled. The kids are off to college and the pet can't go with them. No time for a pet, or it got too big. Pregnancy. Kids are mean to the animal. The family wants to travel more. A relative died and left a pet nobody wants to care for. The dog is too dumb to train (one of my favorite lip biters). I can easily go on and on, that's not where I wish to focus my thoughts and energy. Suffice to say it's a challenge to respectfully and professionally respond to the person on the other end of the phone, or across the counter, who is throwing their helpless and voiceless friend away for little or no reason at all.

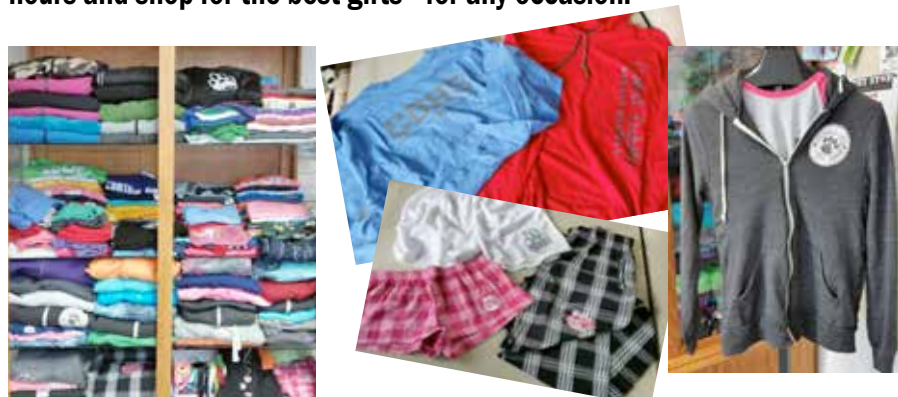
Me wishing that everyone cares for animals like I do is not going to happen. Ever. I accept that. But here is also what I know to be true. People who care for animals and other people are some of the finest folks in this world! Time and time again I see good people show up, step up, and give of themselves to make life better for animals and people in a thousand different ways. The choices we make affect not just ourselves, but ripple through our families and community. Our actions and examples reach people (and animals) in ways we probably never see. That is the good I choose to focus on.

Our mission is to care for these pets in the shelter, no matter the circumstances how they arrived, and send them home with families who promise to care for them forever. Adoption opens the door to help another, then another ... and on it goes. Sometimes the one by one successes still seem like they're not enough. It's tempting and understandable to get drawn to that dark cloud of thought on occasion.

Yet there is something that pushes us to keep fighting the fight. To keep educating the public about the importance of spaying and neutering. To open our homes to foster an animal in need. Supporting nonprofits doing good works in our communities. To be a voice and a vote for those who cannot speak for themselves. We can spiral into despair and complacency, or we can fight for what's right and just wherever we encounter injustice. It may still be a swirling vortex at times, but it takes only a fraction of a second to see all the rewards to be gained. And that is enough to fuel us, one day at a time.

How to help CDHS

How do you help CDHS? Everyone has ways that they contribute to the success of the CDHS shelter – helping our staff, volunteers and board as they work to successfully care for the pets at the shelter and find them new, loving homes.

Some people contribute money annually. Some donors offer a monthly withdrawal from their credit card that goes straight to the pets at the shelter. Some people contribute their time by volunteering at the shelter. Others may not be able to come to the shelter, but they offer assistance at our fundraising and public events. We have a great group of bakers who make goodies for our events because that's what they can do. Some members of the public support our mission by making sure their pets are spayed and neutered and don't contribute to the pet overpopulation problem. Some of our supporters collect items that we can use at the shelter. Many young supporters ask for donations to the shelter instead of birthday gifts for themselves. Groups hold fundraisers and give the cash to the shelter to support our expenses. Some businesses donate in honor of an employee, or agree to match an employee's donation. Other businesses allow us to hold events in their store, and help promote our events. Some people drop their change into our community collection canisters. Some supporters have named CDHS in their will or long-term finance plans. Some take advantage of the ND tax credit by donating \$5,000 or more and getting a very substantial state and federal tax break. Some folks visit the shelter and teach their children how to respect animals and treat them kindly. Some people talk to their neighbors and friends about the great work that CDHS does. Some children send us their monthly allowance, or give us their tooth fairy money. Some people make sure to put ID tags on their pets so if they are lost they can be reunited with their owner. Some people rescue animals that are lost or tossed out.

Whatever it is that you do, we appreciate you. Your kindness and support are never taken for granted. You are the reason we are able to help so many homeless, abandoned, and injured pets. The famous saying is, "It takes a village to raise a child." It also takes a village to support a charitable cause. Our cause is doing great things for pets and people. And with support from our "village" we will continue doing just that.

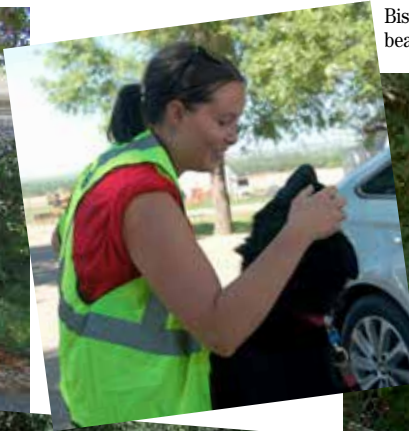

Looking for opportunities to help?

Summer is always a busy time at CDHS

and we like it that way. We have many things going on at the same time, and many critters to attend to. With your help, we can continue to keep this busy pace throughout the next few months. If you want to help but aren't sure what to do, here's a list of ideas to get you started.

Attention Families: When the appeal of sleeping in and watching as many reality shows as possible in one day wears off for your teenagers and they whine, "I don't have anything to do," you can now start to think about offering your services to Central Dakota Humane Society.

It really is a win/win because you and your children get out of the house, help creatures in need, and you might just have a smashing time doing it. From volunteer dog walking to helping with yard work, we need it all. Our critter companions are the best around, but we never have enough. We average 50 dogs at the shelter and 90% of those can benefit from regular exercise and companionship. You and your family provide that by simply attending a dog walking orientation class that is offered once a month for one hour, and then filling out a volunteer application form. After that, you can show up anytime the shelter is open and you don't have to call ahead to make an appointment. Just put on your bug spray, sunscreen, and tennis shoes and off you go with your very new best furry, barking friend.

Walking dogs isn't your thing? We have an abundance of weeds! Although we have an awesome volunteer that does our mowing and another one that tends to weeds, it would be nice to have groups of volunteers take on some of the weeding and "adopt" an area of the shelter they would be willing to keep weed free all summer. The shelter doesn't even have to be open for this project.

Attention Active Adults: Really, do you have to go golfing 5 days a week? When there

is a new dog coming into the shelter every few days that could benefit from your kind voice and gentle handling as soon as they come off of quarantine? Just 30 minutes on a weekday afternoon with 2 or 3 dogs will definitely change their world.... And it might just change yours as well.

Attention Cat lovers: We always need you to help socialize our kittens and spend time with our FIV positive cats that are sometimes at the shelter for an extended period of time. Make an impact on the life of a shelter cat and you may just find that a few minutes of your afternoon puts you in a good mood the rest of the day.

If being a volunteer critter companion isn't your cup of tea, but you want to help, we have plenty of other opportunities through our fundraising events.

Dog Days Deals Rummage Sale. August 10th we will be setting up for our annual Dog Days Deals Rummage Sale fundraiser to be held at the shelter parking lot under the big tent. All hands on deck for this one! We can use help to haul boxes full of treasures, some heavy and some light. If you can't help set up, maybe you can come Thursday, August 11,

through Saturday, August 13, and buy some things you just can't live without.

Saturday we will again need as many volunteers as possible to help put unsold items into groupings for other nonprofits we share our items with.

The Shaggy Shuffle. We will be needing volunteers September 18th for registration, distribution of food, prizes, and of course as many walkers as possible to make this great annual event even more successful in 2016.

Raffle Sales. This is another project where the more volunteers working on it the better it is for CDHS. We will start selling raffle tickets for a number of items throughout the summer. 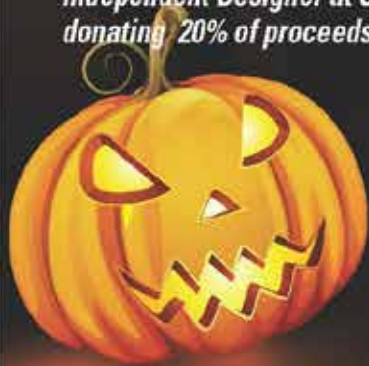
